TCT - Team Capability Testing

SWAT/SRT teams rely on overwhelming force, speed and surprise when planning a takedown. Most call outs deal with untrained, unskilled individuals. Although these individuals are dangerous, they are less of a threat than a terrorist or cell that has received the equivalent of Special Forces training.

SWAT TEAMS are made up of very athletic and highly skilled individuals. Teams are trained on bus takedowns, room entries, CQB, weapon disarms, sniping and other related skills considered critical to the team's success. Training is conducted on static/moving targets and in shoot houses. There is only a limited amount of field training possible and most of this does not take place against adversaries. In addition, gross and fine motor skills deteriorate rapidly under stress. Therefore, any opportunity for team members to participate in 'real life' scenarios can only be to their benefit.

A key component of any ANTI/COUNTER TERRORISM PROGRAM is the assessment phase. There has been a great deal of attention devoted to threat assessments for cities, ports, buildings and critical infrastructure, but little devoted to the capability of our nation's response teams. We have developed a unique program specifically designed to test the response of your team. Our training team is composed of SPECOP personnel who have worked against terrorists in the field and are well versed on their SOP's.

TCT will provide you with the following:

1. A clear indication of how your team and team members will respond to an in-extremis act.
2. An indication of your team's skill degradation under duress.
3. An assessment of what skills are lacking and what additional training is necessary to prepare your team for an effective response.
4. Invaluable experience for your team to operate in a "simulated terrorist exercise" (STE).
5. An ability to increase your team's mental state and confidence when called to respond.
6. An opportunity to let the terrorist community know that WAR (we are ready) for them and will respond effectively, aggressively and decisively. Terrorists prey on perceived weakness.

The sniper incident in northern Virginia provided us with a number of lessons learned. One of those lessons is that law enforcement is prepared for the conventional, not for the unconventional. When faced with a possible terrorist act, the conventional model is ineffective. This also applies to SWAT/SRT response. In a conventional response, the possible number of casualties are relatively limited. In a terrorist response, the SWAT/SRT team could be preventing the loss of thousands of lives or protecting our national security. As the terrorists begin launching their attacks, it is imperative that the elite members of law enforcement are well prepared to handle a number of possible scenarios. Your response will effect the terrorists' decision to launch similar attacks across the United States.

The TCT is unique in a number of respects. Your team will be tested by the JACKALS, a highly trained team composed of former SPECOP personnel, some of who have served on the world's elite counterterrorist teams. This team will respond and act like a terrorist cell. You will not be familiar with their tactics or strategy so you will be faced with the unknown. Your team will be operating at unprecedented levels of stress and this will be as close to reality as it comes.

During the TCT, your team will be debriefed on SOP's and safety practices before being provided with a call-out to which you are expected to respond. The response could be to any one of the following: *Airplane, Power plant, School, Theme park, Hospital, School, Bank, Theater, Government building, Bus, Home, Port, Marina, Coastal area*

Teams equipped with Simmunition equipment will proceed with the assault. The assault will have referees and the exercise will be video taped for post-analysis.

We will provide your department with the following:

1. Team evaluation.
2. Team member evaluation.
3. Training recommendations.
4. Equipment recommendations.
5. JACKAL team rating of one through five stars; one being satisfactory and five being ELITE LEVEL. All participants will receive a JACKAL patch for their uniform, indicating that they have been put to the test and have passed the evaluation.

Current training methods are still based on a "traditional model" that is outdated and not effective for the new threat conditions. Current threat conditions dictate that SWAT/SRT teams are adequately equipped and trained to respond to a number of scenarios. One of those scenarios, a waterborne threat, could target a small craft, cruise ship, or cargo laden-vessel.

Maritime response and interdiction requires a specialized level of training that most departments are ill-equipped to handle. A number of variables, that are unique to this callout, have to be considered in the planning, deployment, and execution phases.

We offer a Maritime Response Training program that addresses these needs. The lead instructor and developer of this program is Tom Rothrauff Jr., Chief Operating Officer of the Trident Group.
